Discipling to Spiritual Maturity Dan Harrison, CE Chairman

It might be helpful at the outset of this article to define spiritual maturity before we make any attempt to figure out how to produce it.

In the King James Version, maturity is often translated "perfect." In that sense, maturity is engaging in behavior appropriate to the present stage of development. A four-year-old is mature when he or she does everything that's reasonable for a four-year-old to do. We would never consider a four-year-old immature because he can't do what a twelve year old can do. On the other hand if the fouryear-old doesn't do what four-year-olds are capable of, then he's immature. So one definition of maturity has to do with living up to the capacities God has made possible for believers.

Another definition has to do with qualities like those listed in Ephesians 4. A mature person is one who uses his or her spiritual gifts, who is building the body, who is discerning truth from error, who is speaking the truth in love, who is in God-honoring relationships with people. Maturity is a mind-set and heart-set of pressing toward the mark; immaturity is complacency and self-satisfaction.

How does spiritual maturity come about? Who is responsible for a quality and quantity of spiritual formation that could truly be defined as spiritual maturity? The person in Ephesians 4 who carries the primary responsibility is the pastor-teacher. It is the pastors responsibility to intentionally nourish the congregation in such a way that spiritual maturity is the end result.

Today numbers of pastors are trying to fill too many roles and the end result is that their primary roles and responsibilities are suffering as a result. A good many local church leaders have not been able to move their congregations to true spiritual maturity because they have lacked a clear focus for their limited time and energy

A key task for spiritual leaders is to create a climate and a context in which spiritual growth are possible. Some of the very primary means of spiritual nourishment are worship, pastoral care, and the teaching of Scripture for life application. Small groups such as Sunday School classes are excellent places for at least two of these to take place. Pastoral care is most effective when it is

relationship based and not position based. Just because a pastor fills the position of pastor does not mean he is in the best position to offer pastoral care to someone in need. Obviously the person who best knows and understands the individual and their needs is in the strongest position to minister. Also Biblical truth is best learned within a context of accountability for application where a person can be taught to obey.

Discipleship has a lot to do with being in community with other believers. We set people up for failure when we allow them to muddle along by themselves with no one to honestly share their struggles with. There must be a commitment to honest and personal sharing if believers are to progress in the faith.

I believe there is a lot of guilt in the body of Christ when it comes to spiritual maturity. Some find it easier to move through the motions and do what is expected of them rather than honestly admit that they are not growing and maturing in the faith. It would be a wonderfully liberating (cont. on page 2)

thing if pastors and board members could honestly confess their sense of failure and spiritual hunger with one another. If they could also agree to commit themselves to pressing toward spiritual maturity by praying together and holding each other accountable for Christlike living, a wonderful model could emerge for the entire congregation.

Spiritual vitality is something all believers hunger for. If those in leadership positions will in fact lead the way to spiritual maturity others will gladly follow. When churches are filled with healthy Christians who are sensitive to the leadership of the Holy Spirit outreach ministries will happen naturally. Discipleship may well be the key to renewed evangelism in our lives and in our churches. Healthy believers are essential for healthy churches and healthy churches generate growth. Growing inwardly may well be necessary before we can grow outwardly but we must be careful and not allow inward growth to be an end in itself.



On September 19-21 church leaders and pastors met in the Campus Center at Circleville Bible College to participate in the Model Church training seminar.



Most of us struggle with accountability. We, as leaders, both clergy and laity, must accept a high degree of accountability if we want the church to grow and reach people.

Accountability includes literally every area of the church ministry. From the time we begin to see the vision of God for our church, the setting of goals and the strategy for reaching them, there must be a high degree of accountability. If there is not, we will have a tendency to start well but soon revert back to the same old way that we have always conducted our ministry and not reach the fulfillment of the vision that God has for our church.

Discipleship flows into many of the key areas of the church. Leadership, lay ministry, assimilation, pastoral care, evangelism and stewardship all involve the church having a discipleship ministry that prepares a person for the area of ministry that God has gifted that person in. Without a well thought out ministry of discipleship our converts will never become the Christians that God intended them to be. Usually, if a new Christian is not involved, he will be gone in six months.

Model Church will help your church to develop proper accountability and discipleship. They are a must if we are to be effective in this day in which we live.

Discipleship at Circleville Jefferson Church by Wes Humble Discipleship Team Leader

Realizing the need for a close walk with God, the Jefferson Church Discipleship Team targeted 1994 as a year for the leaders of the church to experience discipleship and accountability firsthand. Thirty-eight people responded by signing up for once a week discipleship classes over the next 18 weeks. We are using discipleship ministry material produced by Charles Lake Ministries of Greenwood, IN.

These studies include lessons on spiritual gifts, Bible study, prayer, witnessing, discipline and many other relevant topics. Each week the participants are required to hand in accountability sheets outlining their study and prayer life over the last seven days. I would highly recommend this material as an aid to discipleship in our churches. It is designed for newer Christians but due to the serious lack of spiritual discipline among many Christians it is a very excellent tool to strengthen those who have been a part of the church for years.
