What Will It Take To Reap The Harvest?

One of the most effective ways to reach people for Jesus is to begin brand new churches. In fact Lyle Schaller in his book, Innovations in Ministry, has stated that if a denomination wishes to remain on a plateau in size it is necessary to plant one new congregation annually for every 100 to 150 existing churches. If the goal is significant new growth, that process must be accelerated to launching two new missions annually for every one hundred existing churches. If the goal is to reach substantial numbers of vounger generations and also new immigrants to the U.S., a reasonable goal is three new congregations annually for every one hundred existing churches.

As a denomination we are in a fairly rapid learning curve in regard to learning how to effectively plant new churches. But with our present resources it would be difficult for us to begin enough new churches annually to move back into a healthy growth pattern denominationally. This means we must help existing churches again experience the romance of evangelism.

David Crosby of "Crosby, Stills, and Nash" was recently in the news because of a serious physical problem. He had a rapidly deteriorating liver condition that could only be corrected by a transplant. After being on a transplant list for a period of time a donor liver became available and Crosby received a new lease on life.

There is some interesting parallels between his situation and the experience of sinners who come to Christ. Before his disease could be cured a donor had to be found someone had to die. Nothing short of someone dying could save him. No other method of treatment would be adequate.

Man is born with the terminal illness of sin which results in separation from God. But God has given His Son Jesus to become our donor. He has given His life that we might find acceptance, forgiveness and salvation through the power of His shed blood. In Him and Him alone we find life that is abundant in this world and eternal in the world to come.

Are we still convinced that people are genuinely lost? Do we really believe with our whole heart that the only way to the Father is through His Son? Are we

prepared to take the gospel message into the market place where terminal sinners abound?

What are we doing to equip ourselves with the necessary tools to effectively reach lost people? How much of what we do in our church is geared toward genuine heart transformation and life change? How much attention do we pay to the needs of our community? Are we targeting ministries that will meet those needs? How much of the business of our church just creates activity without much to show for it? On a scale of 1 to 10 how would you rate the overall outreach effectiveness of your congregation?

Let me leave you with a powerful quote from Billy Graham. "The evangelistic harvest is always urgent. The destiny of men and of nations is always being decided. Every generation is strategic. We are not responsible for the past generation, and we cannot bear the full responsibility for the next one; but we do have our generation. God will hold us responsible as to how well we fulfill our responsibilities to this age and take advantage of our opportunities."

Souls hang in the balance! It is time we enter anew the ripened fields and reap the harvest for the Lord. There are no acceptable excuses for anything less than our best effort!

The organ had been turned on prior to the service and as we were preparing to begin, smoke began coming out of the back of the organ. It was quickly shut off and unplugged. In a few seconds more damage was done than was economically practical to repair.

If someone would have called out "FIRE" everyone would have understood the meaning. Some would have left the building without knowing the problem or the fact that there was not any real danger to anyone.

There are many in life who are caught in various circumstances in life who are calling out "HELP." The tragedy is often the call is in a different language than with which the church is familiar. The cry is often not made at the church but by their absence. They are not wanting an invitation to church but rather may be extending an invitation to the church to help them rather than count them.

The organ was damaged beyond repair in a minute or less. The crises seldom happens that fast to people or families but the damage is equally destructive.

A "Focus on the Family" story of Dick Gauch shows this to be the case for their family. Rev. Gauch prior to his conversion was a Regional Director for an insurance company. While in an office of one of the managers he received a call that informed him that his daughter was on drugs. With his giant sized ego he felt that they could reclaim their daughter but he found that hope destroyed because her addiction was greater than their resources. In desperation they turned to Christ. The reclamation process did not begin with the daughter but the family. Slowly but effectively God brought restoration to the family and then added a ministry to reach troubled families to bring scriptural healing to the soul.

The cry for "HELP" is coming from all ages and in different ways. One size or method does not fit all. The message cannot change but the containers must. Rev. Ruben Welch speaking at a Ministerial Convention on Ephesians 4:1-16 told us that "the gifts placed on the altar to God may range from paper cups to crystal but God's grace is in each."

Dick Gauch will speak at a 7:30 PM Christian Education Rally on March 10, 1995 at Heritage Temple, 2295 South High Street, Columbus, Ohio. Mike Russell will be the song leader and soloist. He also directs the Brookside Church Choir of Chillicothe who will be singing for the service as well.

There are few who would ever charge us with being anything less than evangelical. That, in itself, does not necessarily mean that we evangelize. One is being, the other is doing.

It seems almost a contradiction that one's belief does not affect one's behavior. What is the secret that unlocks the chains of inhibition and reticence in setting us free to persuade others to believe what we embrace? What is it that hinders our approach to unbelievers? Can salespeople ever be convincing if they themselves are not fully persuaded of the products that they are trying to sell to others? These questions and others have an answer. Perhaps our reluctance reveals our lack. We are devoid of impetus, enthusiasm, conviction and burden. We are paralyzed with fear of rejection and recalcitrant to the clear command of Christ. We refuse to risk a friendship of someone whom we think may take offense. We chafe at the thought of being a personal witness to someone whose only destiny is a Christless hell. Evangelism is the remedy for our decline. There is not substitute (no matter how socially attractive) for bringing people to Jesus Christ. I am an offense to the Gospel if I do not perpetuate its message to others.

Evangelism for us, as a district, is not an option. Our methods are not so archaic that they are ineffective. They are only that way when they are not saturated with the love and appeal and fragrance of a yearning soul. My exhortation is to use whatever means, private or public, to the masses or the one on one. I long to see again personal evangelism.

When Philip saw the Ethiopian cunuch in the Gaza desert the Spirit said to him, "Go near and join thyself to this chariot." "And Philip ran thither to Him." The word *join* in the Greek is a word from which we derive our English word *glue*. The Spirit was saying to Philip, "Go glue yourself to that chariot." He did and he stuck to it until the cunuch got saved. If we would practice the same thing with sinners, we also would see many of them find Christ. Do not quit on that unsaved husband, wife, child, neighbor, fellow employee, friend or the nameless. Stick to them like glue.

We must evangelize!

Acquaint Prospects with Church Members

Rather than hold a series of adult membership training classes, Granite Falls Church orients prospective members using a progressive dinner ("a course in three courses") as the forum. Each host is a church member. The group begins at one home for the salad course and begins getting acquainted. The pastor teaches the unit on theology. At the next home, the group dines on the entree and learns about the local church. The third host provides the dessert and at that stop, the pastor instructs about the wider church. By the end of the day, the group is well-fed, well-oriented and well-acquainted. The pastor has had virtually no problems securing volunteer hosts. When the classs is small, the pastor recruits hosts who have smaller homes. With big groups, she looks for those who have large dining rooms. "The hosts really enjoy getting to know the new people."
