Developing Leaders in Your Church (by Bill Benner

Have you ever thought about what it takes for your church to be effectively accomplishing the different ministries that it is involved in week-to-week; the outreach, the worship, the teaching? It takes people, people who are willing to take a leap of faith and step into positions of leadership. It takes people who are willing to get involved. We need people to serve in order for ministry to effectively touch lives. And Christians need to serve in order for their spiritual lives to thrive. Ephesians 2:10 says, "We are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."

So, where are these people, these "leaders" that your church so desperately needs. Often there are people right in our congregations that exert leadership gifts in the work place or in social areas of the community. But when it comes to church, they often feel incapable or spiritually inadequate, so take a "back pew" in involvement. One of our tasks as pastors and spiritual leaders in the church is to identify these gifts in the church.

The Christian Education Department has several programs that can help you do this. Two of them, "Joshua's Men" and "Mentoring Women," are leadership courses designed for developing men and women with leadership gifts. The goal of both of these programs is to have men and women commit one year to the development of their leadership potential and Christian character formation. I would tell you up front that neither of these programs are a "quick fix". Neither are they for new Christians. Both require a year commitment to once a month meetings, a book to be read each month, and commitment to the group. But what you get in return is well worth the effort. Each month there is a different focus on an area of concern for the growing Christian, areas such as Leadership, Spiritual Disciplines, People Skills, Men's or Women's Issues, Evangelism, Marriage, Parenting and Ministry. As your group goes through the books, lessons and times of sharing I have found that they grow both in their understanding of what God wants to do in them as believers and also in their responsibility to others as a follower of Christ. If you are serious about growing Christian leaders for service, be sure to check these two programs out.

Sunday School by Mike Grable

I recall many years ago, being a part of a Sunday School class for primary age boys. It was not a large class, just a few of us as students. I really do not recall anything special as far as what we were taught in that class, but I do remember that our teacher possessed a true love for God and a genuine concern for those



he taught and he was willing take on the assignment of teaching that class of boys. There was one special thing the teacher did for the class. Every so often, the teacher would measure the height of every student in the class. He would have each student stand up against the door jamb and draw a line to show how much they had grown since the last time they were measured. Many lines marked that door

jamb as each student was able to track his growth. And I am sure that the desire of every student was they would show that they had grown since the last time they stood against that jamb, and were continuing to grow.

In Matthew 16, Jesus told his disciples, "I will build my church." We believe that God's desire is that His children and His churches should grow. It is not always an easy task. There is an adversary who makes it his business to try and discourage, thwart, and frustrate God's work-growth-in any way possible. God, however has promised that He would build His church. The beauty of that promise includes the fact that God has designed that we are to be the building blocks He used to build His church. In Ephesians 2, Paul wrote about God's pattern for growth. "Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God's people and members of God's household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In Him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. And in Him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by His Spirit," (Ephesians 2.19-22, NIV). What a great possibility that God is willing to take you and I and make us a temple in which God lives!

There are the possibilities of growth. Usually excitement and enthusiasm accompany growth. Excitement can fill a church when the people see new faces in their services. Enthusiasm can infiltrate the congregation when they realize that as a church they are growing in their faith and their commitment and their resolve to the Lord. Excitement can fill the heart of an individual when that person realizes they are growing in their walk with the Lord. Just as students in that Sunday School class had a desire to grow, we, as God's children, should have a desire to grow in Him. Although the scriptures do not tell us, I wonder how the disciples felt when they heard Jesus say that He would build His church? I cannot help but think that they were excited at what

would be the result of God building His church and they being part of that growth. But it would take personal growth on their part to see it done. There is the preparation for growth. What am I doing to accomplish growth in my life and in the life of my Sunday School and church? What kind of building material am I offering to God? In 1 Corinthians, Paul again used the analogy of building God's church. As Paul writes, he reinforces the fact that there is only one foundation that we are to build upon and that is Jesus Christ. But he also admonishes us to be careful how we build. In these verses, Paul talks about the various qualities of possible building materials. He talks about using, "gold, silver, costly stones, wood, hay, or straw." there is a great deal of difference in those materials. It is very obvious which materials out to be selected in God's build process. Am I giving the best of my life, the best I have to offer to God, so that He may take what I offer and bring growth as a result?



CE Convention for the Carlbbean

Ruthine Joseph (from the West Indies District) and I had talked about having a C.E. Convention on Dominica. Then we planned and talked some more. Soon it became a reality! Feb. 21, 22, 2003 was the date. So I planned and worked and prepared handouts, and purchased things to take down with me. God blessed me with a traveling companion, Barb, which in turn blessed me with an extra suitcase to fill with supplies, handouts, and teaching materials.



Excitement was in the air! The West Indies District was having their first C.E. Convention! We met at the Newtown Church, with a full house! The plans were for a time of worship, encouragement, and instruction on Friday evening as one group. My part on Friday evening was that of instruction. I spoke for about 50 minutes on "How to form a lesson plan when teaching right out of the Bible." The excitement and response was awesome. It is so exuberating to teach to a crowd of people who are giving you their undivided attention!

On Saturday there were two tracks. The pastors and Sunday School Superintendents met upstairs with Dan Harrison while I taught the Sunday School teachers in the sanctuary. My big mistake was to estimate that I needed 45 handouts for each seminar. By noon, I had 150 people in the sanctuary! They were eager to learn, listen, take notes, and ask for materials to help them in their Sunday School classes.

I covered the following topics: Bible Memorization, Creative Teaching Ideas, The Ten Commandments, and The Basic Learning Styles. After each seminar I was literally surrounded by teachers wanting to talk. It was wonderful!

Barb and I gave a few supplies to ten different churches (financed partly by Beulah Chapel's ladies group). We had worked for weeks on tracing and coloring sets of the 10 commandments posters. We drew out churches names and gave away 12 sets. During the memorization seminar, I grouped the teachers in groups of about 10 and had them play games as we memorized a Scripture. That was fun! They also gave me some ideas to bring home with me. The sock puppets were wanted by all, but only one lady was the recipient. Perhaps another time, we can have a "make it-take it" seminar and let everyone make a sock puppet.

Many teachers asked for materials and curriculum to help them in their teaching task. Hopefully this need will be met, as we launch an "Adopt a Church" project from the C.E. Board.

Overall, the convention was one of excitement and learning. It was a privilege to meet new brothers and sisters from the islands, and minister to them, and to aid them in their local church ministries.

Yes, our flights were canceled and we had to reschedule to a different airlines and a different airport. Yes, our luggage was too heavy to carry. Yes, our luggage did not arrive on time. Yes, I got carsick driving across the island. Yes, I got sick, sick as I was leaving the island, but if God opened the door, I'd do it again!
